


HIV Status in the United Kingdom

As the fact sheet below shows, approximately 98,400 (93,500-104,300) people were living with HIV in the UK in 2012. The overall prevalence was 1.5 per 1,000 population (1.0 in women and 2.1 in men).

The diagnose moment is really important. If they are diagnosed promptly people living with HIV can expect a near normal life span and better clinical outcomes. Earlier treatment must be combined with a substantial increase in the frequency of HIV testing among groups most affected.

In 2012, 6,360 people (4,560 men and 1,800 women) were newly diagnosed with HIV in the UK, a slight increase on 6,220 diagnoses in 2011. Like the previous year, this is an estimated new HIV diagnosis rate of 1.0 per 10,000 population (1.5 per 10,000 men and 0.57 per 10,000 women). While overall trends show a decline in new HIV diagnoses since 2005.
